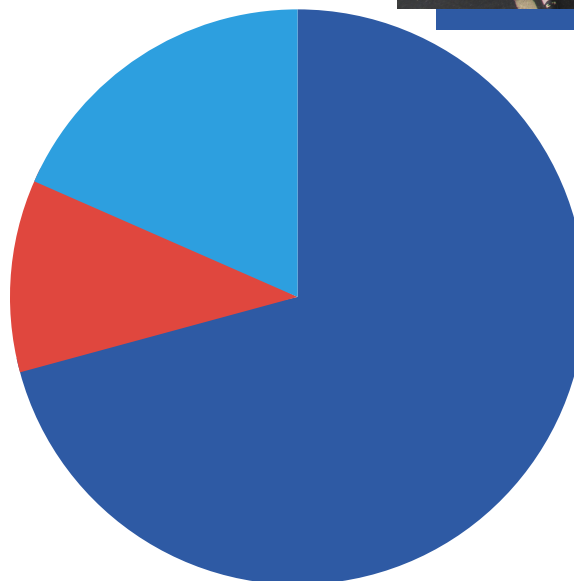

# OUTCOMES

---

## Operation School Bell®

- 23,665 students from 110 schools in 13 districts were served by OSB
- 1,617 Tulsa Public Schools elementary students were clothed onsite at our building
- 1,599 elementary students from outlying school districts were clothed at area Walmart stores.
- 29,680 uniform shirts (2 per child) were delivered to TPS elementary schools
- 6,952 TPS secondary (junior and high schools) students received clothing and other essential items
- 226 TPS high school students were recipients of OSB ALTSA (ALT Scholar Awards) in the amount of \$39,864 to cover concurrent enrollment fees

## Betty Bradstreet Arts Education

- \$90,375 was awarded to area fine arts teachers to support classroom needs, impacting over 13,500 students

## STEM Education

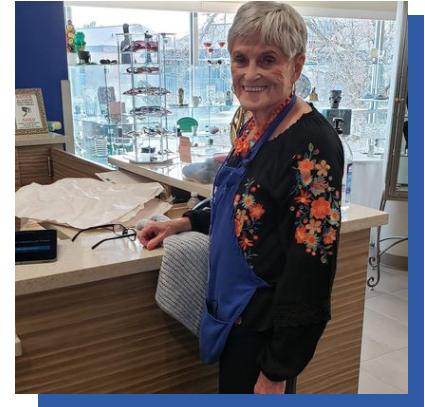
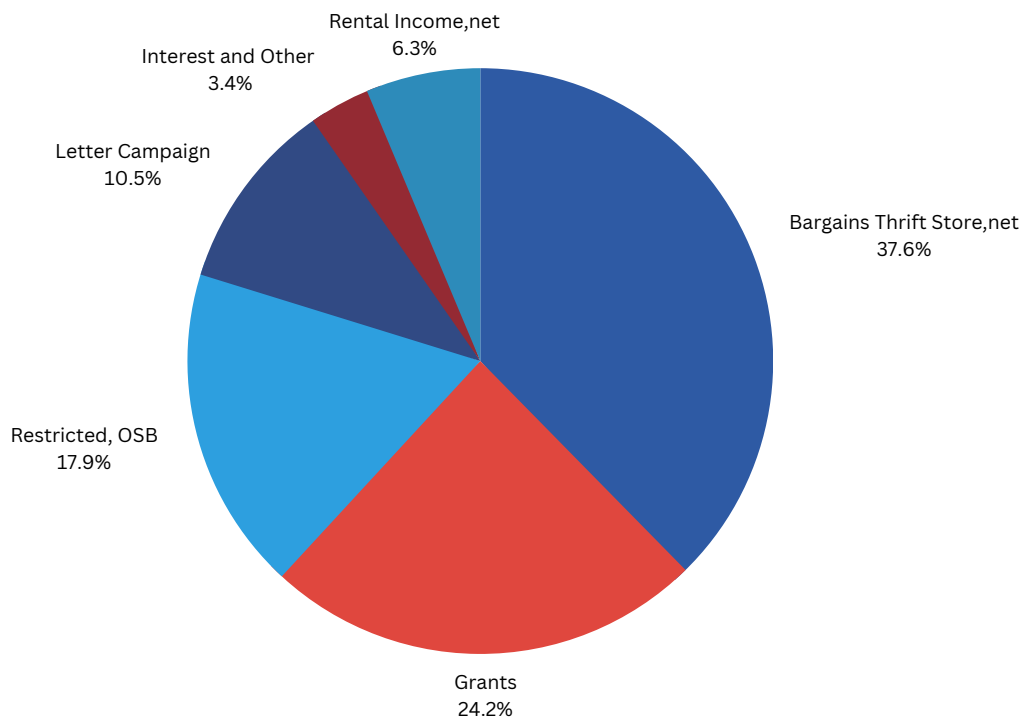
- 4,138 STEM-in-a-bag kits were assembled by AL Tulsa volunteers and distributed to area schools
- Equipment was purchased for Tulsa Regional STEM Alliance STEM Shoppe for area teachers use

## Community Partners

- 49 car seats and clothing helped 840 children through partnership with Fostering Connections
- 46 Pack N Plays and clothing helped 131 children through partnership with Emergency Infant Services
- 518 individuals at Denver House, Waker Hall, Altamont and Yale Apartments received essential items through partnership with Mental Health of Oklahoma
- Over 640 senior citizens were given household items baskets, Christmas stockings, art supplies and games through partnership with LIFE Senior Services
