Assistance League® Tulsa is again proud to extend to Tulsa area public school fine arts teachers the opportunity to apply for a Betty Bradstreet Arts Education Award for art, drama and music classroom projects. Please forward this letter to fine arts teachers in your district.

All public-school teachers of fine arts in the Tulsa area are eligible to submit a proposal. A selection committee of Assistance League® Tulsa volunteers will review the applications and provide as many awards as funding will allow. Committee members will schedule an onsite visit to meet each teacher receiving an award and to observe the children enjoying items purchased with the award.

Teachers are invited to apply online at altulsa.org/programs/BettyBradstreet. They should complete the Award proposal and return it with an attached detailed, itemized budget that includes copies of estimates for supplies from vendors to bettybradstreet@altulsa.org.

The Award proposal must be received by <u>October 7, 2024</u>. Maximum funding for an individual proposal is \$2,000. This money may not be used for salaries, individual scholarships, field trips or transportation. All proposals will be considered, and selections will be made by October 21, 2024.

Applications will only be accepted online with the Betty Bradstreet Awards Proposal Summary form.
